

Boys' dress code

On days when lessons ('hashes') are taking place, all boys and girls must wear full School uniform from the time they leave their House in the morning until the end of timetabled lessons for that day. School uniform (or, sometimes, for boys, a formal suit) is also specified for Chapel, lectures, concerts, plays and some other occasions.

Girls and boys may wear coats over their blazers or jackets, but not instead of them. Coats or waterproofs should be plain navy blue, dark grey or black, and longer than the jacket or blazer underneath. They must be conventional and formal in style, without overt branding. Casual coats such as puffer jackets, parkas with fur-trimmed hoods or similar are not allowed during the School's formal business.

At other times, girls and boys may wear their own informal clothes, but these must not be scruffy, damaged, ostentatious or revealing. All clothing (both uniform and casual clothes) must be name-taped, smart, clean, in good repair, tidy and appropriate for a school environment.

Boys' hair must be clean, neat and tidy at all times. Length should be sensible (that is, neither shaven nor below the collar). Hair must not be dyed, bleached or worn in an ostentatious style.

Jewellery should be discreet. Boys may not wear earrings. One thin silver or gold necklace and / or bracelet is allowed. A watch may be worn and one plain ring. Other jewellery is not acceptable.

School bags

It is compulsory for boys in the Under School to use a bag for carrying books, papers and equipment to and from hashes. Boys and girls in the Specialists are encouraged to have one. The School does not specify the type

of bag that pupils should use, although two types are currently available for purchase in the School Shop. Pupils might sometimes have to carry books or lever-arch files for three subjects in one journey, so when purchasing a bag, consideration should be given to its strength and capacity, as well as the age and size of the pupil.

The bag should be of a sober colour and should not demonstrate an extreme of style. It should be clearly labelled. Although many bags have a name-card holder, these are often vulnerable to wear and tear, so we recommend that a large nametape (of the kind used for duvets and towels) is either sewn onto the bag itself in a prominent position, or sewn in a loop around a handle.
